Education, Child Development & Family Services Industry Sector



Education, Child Development & Family Services is one of the fastest-growing industry sectors in the nation. It is projected to increase by nearly 40 percent by 2016 due to a large number of employees in this sector who will be retiring.

According to the U.S. Department of Labor, three of the ten fastest-growing segments of this industry sector are child care services; individual, family, community, and vocational rehabilitation services; and community and residential elder care services. Another career in this sector, teaching, will continue be one of California's most vigorous areas of employment.

This industry sector includes four interrelated pathways: Child Development, Consumer Services, Education, and Family and Human Services. Each pathway includes a sequence of at least two rigorous courses, beginning with a foundation class that leads to one or more concentration classes and concluding with at least one capstone course. Through successful completion of a career pathway, students gain skills that enable them to enter the workforce at a higher-than-entry-level step. These courses prepare students to succeed in any of the careers related to the pathway.
