By participating in a Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program, you will receive early review of your academic records, early admission notification and specific guidance about major preparation and general education coursework.

FALL FOCUS

FOR HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS

Complete these steps this Fall, so you are ready to create an education plan in the spring with a Shasta College counselor.

Create an account in CCCApply/MyPath

- You first create a California Community Colleges student account before applying to Shasta College.

Complete your application to Shasta College

- You'll receive 2 emails within 48 hours –
First Email: Confirms application was completed.
Second Email: Provides your unique Student ID Number, Username and log in instructions at Shasta College.
Note: We strongly encourage you to include your **Social Security Number** as it is necessary to link the FAFSA to your student account.



1. Create account **CCCApply/MyPath**
If you already have one, update it with personal email address and current information.
2. Complete Shasta or Butte application.
3. Watch for email from college with college email and sign in information.
4. Activate college portal or self serve account.
5. Complete orientation
6. Complete FAFSA or CADAA

There are many steps to applying.



Community Colleges **require** incoming students to:

1. Meet with a Community College Counselor and
2. Create an Educational Plan (Ed Plan) before they can get classes.



More steps...

After meeting with College Counselor, students will have classes in their **plan**, but will **NOT** have classes.

There will be a date that they will have to Register. They have to remember!
