### Kanye West needs to be stopped, racism on Twitter

Kanye West has once again shown all the reasons why he needs to stay banned off of social media. In his most recent scandal, he tweeted an antisemetic message towards Jewish people, specifically to Mark Zuckerberg. Instagram restricted him due to violating their rules and guidelines, to which he retaliated with, "...I'm going death con 3 on JEWISH PEOPLE the funny thing is that I actually can't be Anti Semitic because black people are actually Jew..". The tweet, posted on October 8th, proceeds to attack Jewish people for "toying" Kanye and that they "black balled" him for opposing their "agenda".

His behavior, combined with his high following on Twitter of 31.1 million people, could be detrimental to the Jewish community. Promoting this kind of hate speech could lead to a rise in hate crimes against Jewish people. Spreading the idea that Jewish people have an "agenda" alludes to the numerous conspiracy theories that have been made against Jewish people. The theories all lead to the idea that Jewish people are attempting to take over the world. Many current theories are influenced by the idea that Jewish people

control mainstream media and that they will take over the world. In another tweet by West, he stated, "who do you think created cancel culture?" double the amount of Jewish people on Earth. Jewish people make up 2% of the US population, yet are 60% of religious hate crimes, which has seen an uptick since 2021. Whether or not more hate crimes happen to Jewish people after his vile tweets, it is still disgusting that he would say such a thing no matter his mental state.

Kanye hasn't opened up much about his mental health since his public diagnosis in 2016. He is one of few celebrities to be openly out with bipolar disorder. But just because Kanye is a cultural icon to many and has a mental disorder doesn't excuse him from facing the consequences of threatening Jewish people on a Twitter account with 31.1 million followers.

 $7_{200}$  miles away, on the 16th of September, a 22 year old woman named Mahsa Amini died after sustaining severe injuries to her head, leading to stroke or brain hemorrhage. The Iranian morality police, or Guidance Patrol, claims that she had suffered a heart attack and fell into a coma. However, this is a lie created by the morality police in order to save face. Mahsa Amini had been beaten and abused by the morality police to such a horrible degree that she died, simply because she had worn her hijab, an Islamic head covering, improperly.

In 2011, Mohamed Bouazizi's death acted as a catalyst that



sparked the Tunisian Revolution and later the Arab Spring. The death of Mahsa Amini has caused a similar eruption of unrest, as anti-government protests across Iran have sprung up in response to her death, seeking to end the brutal oppression that the Iranian government has continued against its own citizens for over 40 years. A quick overview of the rules show that students may






It came out September 3rd this year and you are able to watch the movie in the theaters. They started filming in 2020, so fans have been anxious to see it.



One of the players or the team, Christopher Williams, is so excited about the win that h gets "incredibly sturdy in front of the two teams after their first win in a long time, and his con-




