We should spread democracy through example, not through neo-imperialism. The best way to do this is in conjunction with our friends in NATO, and our neighbors on the American continent. We must remember the lessons from our wars in the Middle East as well as Vietnam, that lesson being that we can no longer effectively stand alone on the world stage.
